Hurricane Season: Are You Ready?

Hurricane Season is June 1 through Nov. 30. This year we are anticipating approximately 20 named storms. A hurricane watch is issued whenever a hurricane becomes a threat to coastal areas. In the event of a tropical storm or hurricane, conserve supplies and resources and plan for up to five days without water or electricity.

- Have a battery powered radio and extra batteries on hand
- Designate a ground-level family gathering space that has no windows and does not share any outside walls (if possible)
- An ample supply of clean water is top priority; Store one or more gallons of water per person, per day

Fan Coil Unit Operations

Do you have an office on the perimeter of the building? You can control the temperature by adjusting the fan coil units. Make certain the Fan Speed Control is on. The knob is located on the left side of the control box. Adjust the air flow by selecting high or low for the fan speed. The thermostat to the center-setting-knob is located on the right hand side of the control box. Turning the knob to the right increases cooling; turning to the left decreases cooling.
