Fan Coil Unit Operation

Now that we are entering the height of the cooling season, we want to remind you, that you have some control of your office temperature, if you are in a perimeter office. You can help control your temperature by adjusting the fan coil units along the outer wall. Follow these easy steps: Make certain the Fan Speed Control is on. This is the knob on the left side of the control box. The medium setting usually works best. You can also adjust the fan speed to either high or low to increase air flow or to decrease air flow. Adjust the thermostat to the center most setting on the thermostat.

This is the knob on the right side of the control box. The center most setting is generally good for most offices, however, turning the knob to the right increases cooling, and turning the knob left decreases cooling. If after making these adjustments you do not feel comfortable, please either submit a work order or call the Management office, and someone will be up right away.

Spotlight on Holiday Waste

Q. How do I dispose of food scraps from preparing my holiday meal - and what about fruitcake?

A. Food scraps, old leftovers and even that fruitcake can be added directly to your compost if you have one. Old cooking oil from the turkey fryer should go in a container with a tight seal and be placed inside the garbage roll cart.

Q. My holiday party includes lots of one-time use items. Can I recycle or compost them?

A. Any disposable items, from plastic ware to paper plates, go in your garbage roll cart. Even products labeled "compostable" or "biodegradable" don't belong in your recycling roll cart. Use reusable items for your next get-together instead.

Q. One of my holiday gifts is a new computer tablet! What should I do with my old computer?

A. If your old one still works, donate it! Electronics do not belong in your roll carts.

Q. How do I dispose of old batteries?

A. Collect batteries and dispose of them at a local recycling depot or hazardous waste facility. They should never be put in any curbside roll carts.

Q. Can I recycle broken strings of lights?

A. Broken lights do not belong in your recycling roll cart. Put them in the garbage or recycle them at a local recycling center.
