Celebrate Earth Day

April 22nd is Earth Day. Here are a few tips you can take home with you to make your home a more sustainable living place for your family and for our environment:

- Buy local, organic produce.
 Doing so reduces plastic waste from wasteful packaging and ensures that you are getting the freshest produce with the fewest harmful pesticides possible.
- Keep a collection of reusable bags in your vehicle, regardless of whether you typically walk or drive to the grocery store.
- Purchase bars of shampoo, conditioner, body soap and hand soap from nearby stores such as A.W. Mercantile at Armature Works, Lush Cosmetics at WestShore Plaza or Buff City Soap at Midtown Tampa.
- Buy used clothing and accessories whenever possible from local thrift stores.
- Use reusable coffee cups and tea cups whenever possible.
- Wash your clothes on a cold setting to reduce energy consumption.
- Switch to LED lights, which run approximately 90% more efficiently than traditional incandescent light bulbs.
- Use natural cleaning products to reduce harmful chemical toxins in the water and air.
- Use cloth napkins and rags instead of paper napkins and paper towels whenever possible.

Recycling & Waste Management

Did you know that one plastic bag takes approximately 1,000 years to decompose? That's why Tampa City Center eliminated the use of plastic liners at each individual trash receptacle in 2008. As a result, we have increased the amount of waste being recycled and have prevented approximately 207,000 plastic bags from going to the landfill each year.

The trash cans at each individual desk may be used for all dry recyclable items, such as empty plastic and glass bottles, empty aluminum cans, paper, cardboard, staples, paper clips and food containers that have been cleaned out.

Tissues, paper towels, waxed paper, tea bags and styrofoam cannot be recycled and should be discarded in a trash can with a plastic liner.

Batteries can be discarded in the mail room located near the loading dock.

A work order can be submitted to have electronic waste removed from your suite and properly discarded.

"This Month In History"

APRIL

1902: Tally's Electric Theater in Los Angeles opens. It was the first theater in the U.S. to be built with the sole purpose to show movies, not stage shows.

1917: The United States formally enters World War I, marking a turning point in the conflict that had been ongoing for nearly three years. The Great War ended just over a year and a half later.

1923: Yankee Stadium in New York City hosts its first baseball game. The Yankees defeated the Red Sox 4–1.

1938: Bugs Bunny makes his first cartoon appearance in "Porky's Hare Hunt."

1954: The United States Air Force Academy is established just north of Colorado Springs, Colo. Cadets attend the academy to receive military training for either the Air Force or Space Force.

1969: The first temporary artificial heart is used to successfully sustain a patient for 65 hours while waiting for a human heart to become available.

1977: Fifteen women in the House of Representatives hold the first Women's Caucus meeting. The bipartisan organization is now known as the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues.

1997: At age 21, golfer Tiger Woods takes the title of Masters champion, becoming the tournament's youngest winner—a record he still holds today.

2004: Google launches the free email service Gmail. Since the announcement was made on April Fools' Day, the public was skeptical of its authenticity. Today, Gmail is actively used by 1.5 billion people around the globe.
